



GRADING POLICY

OVERVIEW:

The objective of the grading policy is to provide service when required and as uniform as possible to the public throughout the Municipality during a normal grading season. For unusual or very difficult conditions, the Municipality will restore normal service as soon as available resources permit. Should rainfall quantities make driving conditions very difficult the Public Works Supervisor may, at his discretion, authorize grading activities as long as the safety of both the general public and the Public Works employees is not compromised.

Level One Roads:

Routes Rural roads and gravel surfaces in the Villages of Whitemouth, River Hills, Seven Sisters, and Elma

Grading spring and fall and during the normal grading routes as determined by periodic checks done by the Grader Operator or the Public Works Supervisor. Or in special circumstances at the discretion of the Public Works Committee.

Level Two Roads:

Routes Fair Weather Roads

Grading At the discretion of the Public Works Committee

Working Conditions:

The maximum shift shall be 12 hours, with a minimum of 8 hours off between shifts.
